- ❖ Clean Fill  
(less than 300lbs per load)

- ❖ Antifreeze (household quantities)
- ❖ Fluorescent

#### ALL RECYCLING MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES:

All Recycling **Must** Be Removed From Bags and Be Relatively **Clean**.

All products should be **removed** from containers prior to recycling.

**NO** - Plastic Bags

**NO** - Planting Pots

**NO** - Styrofoam

**NO** - PVC

**NO** - 5 Gallon Buckets

**NO** - Paint Buckets

**NO** - Wax Paper

**NO** - Plastic Toys

**NO** - Glass

(Exception - Food or Drink Containers)

**YES** - Food, Beverage, or Household Containers Cans  
(metal - steel, tin & aluminum)

**YES** - Food, Beverage, or Household Containers  
(plastic)

**YES** - Food, Beverage, or Household Containers  
(paper)

**YES** - Magazines

**YES** - Cardboard

**YES** - Junk Mail

**YES** - Newspapers

**YES** - Books

**YES** - Metal

**PLEASE NOTE:** Plastics such as, antifreeze and automotive oil containers, pesticide and herbicide containers are 'NOT' recyclable.
